

NOTICE

Per the Seventh Judicial District Court Order, dated March 17, 2020:

Effective March 16, 2020: All jury trials, civil and criminal, to commence on or before April 24, 2020, are suspended and will be rescheduled. However, some cases will be held through other means. Please contact the court prior to your scheduled court date.

In the Matter of the Seventh Judicial District Court's Response to Coronavirus Disease (COVID1-19) the following people may not enter the court facility:

1. Persons who in the last 14 days have traveled to a country designated as a Level 3 travel health notice according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Currently those countries include: China, Iran, South Korea, Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Monaco, San Marino, Vatican City, England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, and Republic of Ireland. The list is subject to change by the CDC.
2. Persons who reside or have close contact with someone who has travelled to any foreign country above within the last 14 days;
3. Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital, or health agency;
4. Persons who have been diagnosed with coronavirus or who has had contact in the past 14 days with anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19; or
5. Persons with unexplained fever, cough, or shortness of breath.

Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols will be denied entry by the District Court Bailiffs or Deputy Sheriffs.

This order shall be reviewed no later than every 30 days and shall continue until modified or rescinded by a subsequent order.
