SUMMARY: AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A REVISION AND CODIFICATION OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF EUREKA COUNTY.

TITLE: THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE 2014 EUREKA COUNTY CODE ADOPTION.

The Board of Commissioners of the County of Eureka, a political subdivision of the State of Nevada, hereby does ordain this revision and codification of the general ordinances of Eureka County, effective the 24<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2014, to be known as the 2014 Eureka County Code.

The Board proclaims that three (3) copies of this Code were filed with the County Clerk at least one (1) week before final adoption.

The Board further proclaims that a notice of the filing was published in the Eureka Sentinel at least one (1) week before final adoption, stating that copies of the Code are available for examination by the general public at the Office of the County Clerk.

The Board directs the Office of the District Attorney to publish (by title only) this ordinance adopting the 2014 Eureka County Code once (1) a week for two (2) weeks in the Eureka Sentinel, and include a statement that copies of the Code may be examined by the general public at the Office of the County Clerk.

The Board directs the Office of the District Attorney to reproduce at least twenty-five (25) copies of the 2014 Eureka County Code, and file at least three (3) copies of the Code with the County Clerk, and two (2) copies with the Librarian of the Supreme Court Law Library.

Effective Date:

This revision and codification of the 2014 Eureka County Code shall be effective upon adoption and publication as provided by the Nevada revised Statutes.


Business Impact Statement.

Pursuant to N.R.S. Chapter 237 the following business impact statement is prepared:


1. The proposed ordinance is not likely to impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a business or businesses.

## PREFACE

Since March 2006, when the most recent codified version of the Eureka County Code (“ECC”) was adopted, numerous ordinances have been adopted creating revisions, modifications, or additions of several Titles of the ECC.

During this July 2014 re-codification of the ECC, those ordinance were compiled and edited by staff under the direction of Theodore Beutel, Eureka County District Attorney. This re-codification is solely to codify and organize the ordinances adopted since March 1, 2006, as well as to create a pagination that allows for easier supplementation.

The code is organized by subject matter under an expandable three factor numbering system similar to the old Code to allow for supplementation without disturbing the numbering of existing provisions. The numbering system includes a Title, Chapter, and Section. For example, ECC 1.10.010 is Section .010 of Chapter 10 of Title 1, entitled “Enactment of Code.” Sections are numbered by tens (.010, .020, .030., etc.).

Legislative history is provided by reference to the repealed original 1989 and 2006 codifications as amended. A Table of Contents is provided at the beginning of the new Code and at the beginning of each Title.

Copies of the new Code are available by requesting a copy from the Office of the Clerk, P.O. Box 677, Eureka, Nevada, 89316, accompanied by payment in the amount of \$25.00. See ECC 1.10.130. This fee may be changed by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners at any time.
