I. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Fiorenzi called the commissioners/quarterly meeting to order at 9:30 am.

Vice Chair Mason called the board to order at 10:10 am.

II. ROLL CALL

III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A. Discussion and Possible Action: Approval of agenda and addition of any emergency items.

IV. PUBLIC COMMENT AND DISCUSSION

A. Discussion: Public Comments

Chairman Fiorenzi called for public comments. Angie Black read the following statement into the record:

“Good morning. For those of you that don't know me, I'm Angie Negro-Black. I have lived in Crescent Valley for over nine years with my husband, Troy, and four children. In the past Troy and I started the Spook Walk for the kids at Halloween and the Christmas Party, which is going on its fourth year and growing. I was approached by a Town Board member and asked to help with community events. So Sandy Spoo and Vickie Etchinek and I said yes, we would help to get things going again. To do these things for the board is very time consuming between planning, getting budgets ready, trips to Elko to get supplies, working with other groups so we can have a successful event. We do this as a charity to the board and community. NONE of us are paid.

In November I rented the Community Center for my child's birthday party. When we got there, the building was filthy. After the party, I made the mistake of complaining that it was filthy. In December we had the building rented for the first week to get ready for the Christmas Party. After Public Work Department Heads had made people cry when they were so rude to

them, and going through all the repercussions that had been made since I had complained the building was filthy, we finally got into it.

We now [come] to the point:

(1) In December we couldn't get into the building until Sandy and I could both be there to do this

checklist; not Sandy, both of us had to be there.

(2) We have to do a checklist to make sure it is clean when we start and when we leave.

(3) We had to change the dates to Bingo since they were five days shy of being exactly 30 days for

the rental and [were] also told, don't forget Bob has the building for karate on Tuesday and

Thursday, so we moved Bingo to Fridays when we had planned on having them Thursday nights.

(4) We have waited since December 14th to know if we even had approval to use the building, since apparently Mr. Damele has to approve the building use. Sandy was finally told we had been approved Wednesday.

(5) Last Thursday, Sandy received a call to see what time we were having Bingo, cause they needed to know for wrestling; then Thursday night this wrestling schedule comes home from the school. Are we the only ones that have to follow this 30 day rule???

(6) Wednesday I spoke with Mr. Williams and told him if the wrestling kids would like to practice on Friday, we had no problem sharing the building with them, since we do have it rented for the day. Mr. Williams was in great appreciation since we are both here for the same cause – the kids and the community. He set practice at 2 o'clock for today.

(7) Yesterday, Sandy asked if we could do the checklist at 9, since we both have prior engagements and [she was] told no, it needs to be done in the afternoon cause the County needs to clean the building. She replied with, I will not be in town in the afternoon since I have to go to Elko, and was told now I don't have to be there.

Question: If the building is being left clean, why do they need to clean? And after us being a day late getting in to the building in December cause we BOTH had to be there, now I don't need to be there??

(8) Last night the children were told at wrestling they could not have practice today. When we have no problem sharing the building, so why is it now we are punishing the children? And since we have the building rented, why are they not allowed to use it?

(9) In December the building was spotless. The only use until this week has been karate. Why was there pee on the floor Tuesday when the wrestling kids got there? We had scrubbed the floors when we left in December.

I would like a little clarification on these rules if possible: Is it 30 days or not? Is there a checklist or not? Do only certain people have to leave it clean or not? Do you have to rent the building for two days so you can get into it the morning that you have it rented for? Do the rules only apply to certain people, or is this just the repercussion that I'm receiving since I called and complained? Cause at this point it's beginning to look like harassment and discrimination to me. And also, [are] we now punishing wrestling children?"

Chairman Fiorenzi thanked Ms. Black for her comments and requested a copy of her written statement, which Ms. Black provided to the Clerk. The Chairman asked if there were any further comments. Dan Slama stated he would like to provide introductory, intermediate, and advanced computer classes at the Community Center.

He won't be charging a set fee, but instead will be taking donations with a suggested donation of \$5.00, which would be waived for school students. He would like to utilize the Community Center on Saturdays from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. for this purpose. The Board explained that administration of renting the Community Center is actually done through the Crescent Valley Town Center. Chairman Fiorenzi suggested that he speak with the School District regarding use of their facility since the classes were of an educational nature.

V. DISCUSSIONS

A. **Discussion:** Update on the Arsenic Treatment Plant in Crescent Valley.

Chair Fiorenzi reported that at their last meeting they were updated that it was up and running at satisfactory conditions.

B. **Discussion:** Update on the Economic Development Study with Rex Massey.

Vice Chair Mason informed of the economic study that Rex Massey is conducting in Crescent Valley, and that it is still on going.

C. **Discussion, Approve, or Deny:** Quote from KFC to bring Crescent Valley's Concession Facility up to Nevada State Health Compliance.

Ron Damelle of Public Works explained the quote was for the updating of the kitchen facility at the rodeo grounds, and bringing it up to code. With this there is a fairly lengthy list of things that need to be corrected at the concession stand. This is basically, a remodel of the entire facility. Chair Fiorenzi asked if this was in the budget, and Ron Damelle, said that this was not specifically put in the budget, but he believes there is enough in the building maintenance budget to pay for it. Chair Fiorenzi asked how many times the facility has been leased in the last year. Ron Damelle said he did not have a number, but he was confident that it will be used more frequently once it is up to code. Vice Chair Page made a motion to table this until Ron Damelle can check the budget for sufficient funds to complete this project. Member Ithermalde 2nd that motion, and Chair Fiorenzi voted "Aye," for the record.

D. **Discussion, Approve, or Deny:** The sketch of the park plans from Eureka County Public Works.

Chair Fiorenzi read the letter from the CVTAB and Ron Damelle explained the sketch that CVATB has voted to approve to go forward with the project. He explained that the plan that the project could begin this spring and finish up this summer to go through two budget years. Vice Chair Page explained that he has spoken with Juvenile Probation and looked into insurance, for the skate park, and it all looks feasible. There could possibly be grant money available to help with the cost of the skate park. Ron Damelle suggested tabling it, sending it back to CVTAB, to review and talk with Juvenile Probation. Member Ithermalde made a motion to send this back to the town board for review, Vice Chair Page 2nd that motion, Chair Fiorenzi voted "Aye," for the record.

B. Discussion: Public Comments

Troy Black commented that the town didn't want the skate park; the Commissioners said that needs to be discussed with CVTAB.
